Re: Year 13 Assessment Information for next half term for [REDACTED]

As you will be aware from Mr George's letter on the 19/03/21, Year 13 students will have further opportunities to demonstrate what they know and can do during the course of next half term. The purpose of this pack of information is to give students all the information they need to prepare fully for these opportunities, which will all take place in normal lesson times. In providing this prior to the Easter holidays, students should have ample time to begin to prepare fully and have some time to relax. Teachers will continue to use the majority of lesson time after Easter to prepare for these assessments.

Year 13 students will have two further periods of formal assessments after the Easter holidays. Each of these continues over a fortnight period. You will see that we have tried to distribute assessments sensibly across each fortnight. The timetable below shows an overview of each fortnight. The coloured squares indicate the periods when subjects in that option block may be having a formal assessment in the lesson. There is a more detailed table below for the subjects in each option block which provides the full information of when assessments will occur in specific subject areas. Each subject has provided greater detail on what topics will be included in each assessment, the types of questions in the assessment and recommendations of appropriate revision resources. If a line is greyed out on the tables below it means the subject is not using that assessment slot. Mr Park has done a video presentation explaining this information which students were shown on Tuesday 30th March. I hope it is evident that we have tried our best to get the balance right in these assessments. Students need sufficient opportunities to show us their full capabilities and we need sufficient evidence to support the grade judgements we are required to submit. At the same time teachers have aimed to focus assessments in a way that does not require students to revise everything for the whole subject. As each assessment has to take place in a normal one hour lesson, this is not like a single high stake exam that you have to revise everything for and try to show your best in the space of e.g. 90 minutes. The assessments will add to our wider evidence base and we believe it is a sensible and fair way to help us generate the grades we need to submit.

As well as preparing for these assessments, it will be equally important that students have the opportunities they need to relax and to mix with family and friends, as society hopefully starts to reopen a little. At this stage, I would urge parents and carers to start discussing with students how they can get the balance right between school work and other activities over Easter. As ever, if you are worried about your son or daughter in Year 11 or Year 13 then please do not hesitate to contact the relevant pastoral team who will be happy to help.
