- Make sure your revision time online is working for you.




#### Useful YouTube'ing

### Mathematics

- Hegarty Maths is the number 1
- It knows you, your strengths and your weaknesses.
- Log on, use your 'red' and 'amber' list from your teacher to tackle your own weak topics.
- Use Fix Up 5s and MemRi on the revision tab for short, recap tasks.
- OnMaths is another excellent resource.
- It gives you the option to attempt full mock papers or papers specific to a particular topic and marks them immediately.
- There are videos covering specific topics <u>and</u> specific target grades.



# Steps for Success

- <u>DO</u> find useful pages, sites and accounts for revision
- <u>DO</u> use a mixture of the above as well as 'hard copy' resources
- <u>DO</u> set yourself time slots for the use of all revision resources.
- <u>DON'T</u> use sites/pages/aps which you'll find distracting, keep them for your non-reivison time as a treat.
- <u>DON'T</u> lie to yourself. If you're revising, great, if you're having down time also great but <u>find a balance</u>.
